Scottish Art



Since we will be moving on to a new topic next week let's do an art piece to represent the famous Scots we have looked at so far.



First, sketch out the shape of the tree using a pencil.






Then paint your base colours on. To make the trunk look more realistic don't use the same shade of brown all over. Make some parts darker and lighter than others. The darker parts would be where the sun can't reach it. Make the roots a lighter colour so that you can write on them later.

Leave this to dry.



Once your painting is dry you can apply the next printing layer to create the texture. Mix up a blue paint that is much lighter than your base blue. Take 3 cotton buds and hold them together like a pen. Dip them in your light blue paint and dab them onto the leaves.



Try to cover the majority of the blue background with your printing technique.




Next, take two of the cotton buds and turn them the other way round and repeat with a light pink colour.



Don't print as much with the pink as you did with the light blue. Have the pink more spread out.



After that, take a black pen to write on the roots. Write the names of the famous Scots you have looked at in our topic. Think of who we studied in class and who you researched at home for your IDL tasks.
