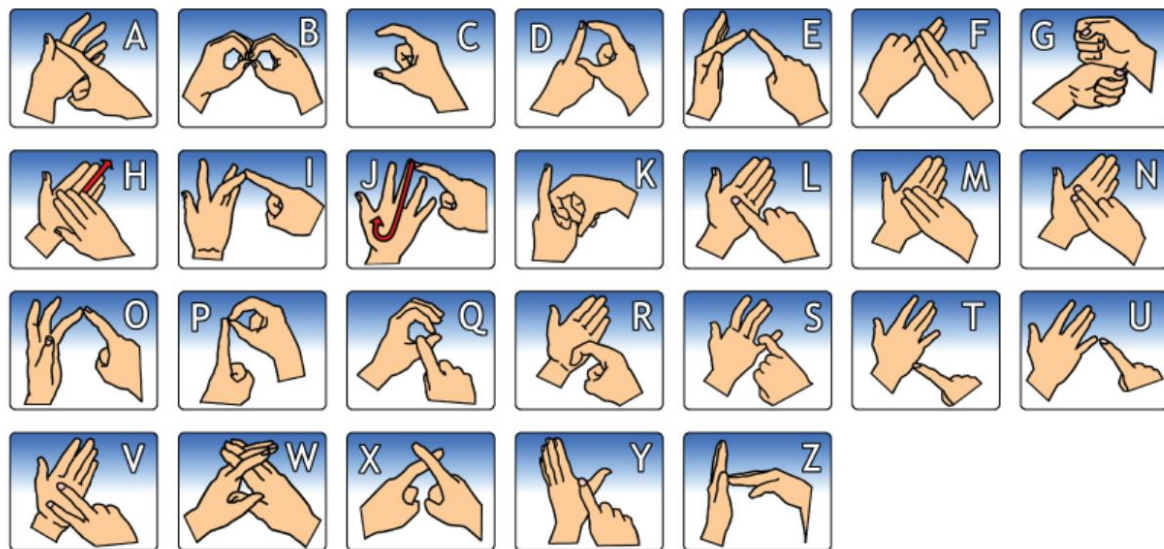

Fingerspelling is a way of spelling words using hand movements. The fingerspelling manual alphabet is used in sign language to spell out names of people and places for which there is not a sign. Fingerspelling can also be used to spell words for signs that the signer does not know the sign for, or to clarify a sign that is not known by the person reading the signer.

This week, can you learn how to spell your words using the fingerspelling alphabet? Why not make it a game! Print out 2 copies of this sheet, give one to someone in your home and keep one for yourself. Use the fingerspelling alphabet to spell out a word and see if they can work out which word you are spelling, then reverse roles, see if you can work out which word they are spelling.



On Friday morning ask someone in your home to test you writing out these words.

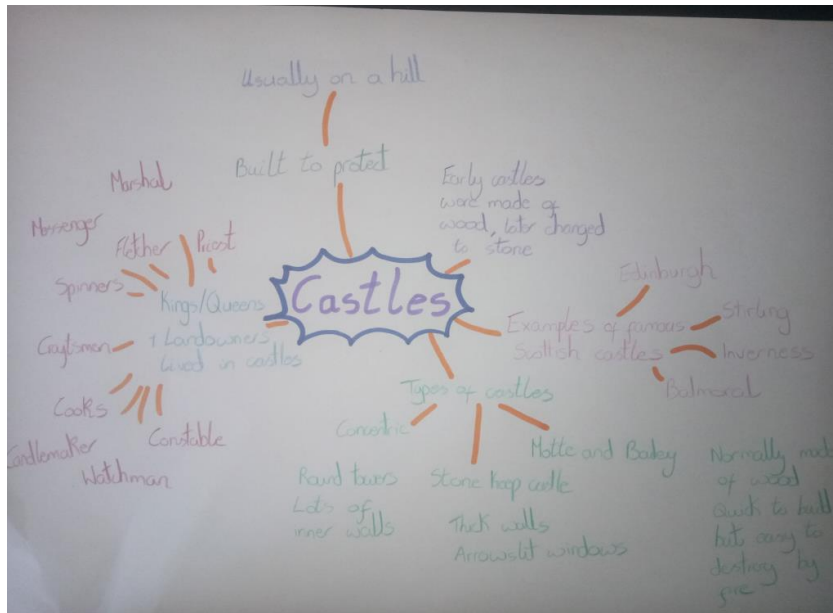
Writing
