



The learning and teaching this term will include:

Languages and Literacy

- *Writing - A variety of topic related activities to develop writing in various genres, including reports/fact files, persuasive posters and letter writing. There will be a focus on core targets and paragraph structure.
- *Spelling - A range of active spelling activities based on the patterns and sounds being learned.
- *Reading - Opportunities to read and respond to a range of texts, including fiction and non-fiction, novels and short texts. There will be a focus on; author's purpose, the main idea and vocabulary.
- *Talking and Listening - Development of skills through class and group discussion, as well as a focus on Body Language, Content and Delivery.
- * French - Classroom objects and weather, writing in French. Revision of basic Spanish (Greetings, farewells, colours and numbers to 20, days of the week). Spanish culture will also be explored.

Maths and Numeracy

- *Heinemann Active Maths (HAM) - Place value. Rounding and Estimating then Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Pupils will also learn more about measure.
- *Number Talks - Developing numeracy skills and strategies to solve mathematical problems.
- *Sports Centre Project - Opportunities to apply mathematics in real life situations, working within a group context.

Health and Wellbeing

- * Post lockdown check-ins and discussion opportunities
- *PE - Developing skills and fitness in an outdoor setting.
- *Emotion Works - Discussing and exploring our mental, social and emotional wellbeing.
- *P7 Roles and Responsibilities - Opportunities for all pupils to take on a Young Leader role.
- * Exploring the Rights of the Child, the Wellbeing Indicators (SHANNARI) and the School's Vision and Values.

Interdisciplinary Learning - Titanic Theme

- *This term pupils will learn about the Titanic disaster. They will use primary and secondary sources to research events from the past, discuss the importance of key events, placing them within a historical sequence, and explore the impact of this historical event on society today.
- *Explore the differences in the class system, leading to discussion and debate surrounding the ethics of this, as well as the impact it had on survival of the passengers.
- * Pupils will take part in a series of science lessons based on a water theme, including investigations into surface tension, buoyancy and dissolving, as well as exploring topical science issues, such as plastics in the ocean.

Discrete Subjects

- *RME - Exploring journeys and pilgrimages across different religions.
- *Art and Design - pupils will have opportunities to choose and explore an extended range of media and technologies to create images and objects in art, based on the Titanic theme.
