Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to school everyone and welcome to Term 4, our last term in school, before the summer break. We hope that you all had a wonderful Easter break, and were able to enjoy the lovely weather, particularly on the first week, when the sun shone every single day.

Although our new term has just begun, we will use this newsletter to share some news, from the end of Term 3 and to remind you of key dates, for the forthcoming term. Take care everyone and enjoy the rest of the month. ⁽²⁾

You Say/We Did: House Point Feedback: Thank you, as always, for all of the positive feedback that you give us on our school. We will always listen to your opinions on how we are doing and will try our best to take action, on anything that you think that we can do to improve, for the benefit of our pupils. Recently, we have been asked to review our House Point system to ensure that there is consistency, in all classrooms, with regards to how this is executed for children. As a reminder, House Points are awarded to pupils for displaying one or more of the attributes, associated with our school values. Our school values are: Growth Mindset, Relationships, Opportunities and Wellbeing.

In addition, to earning points for their own House, children will also be awarded certificates for achieving the following amount of points:

- -25 points- Bronze
- -50 points- Silver
- -75 points- Gold
- -100+ points- Platinum

Certificates are given out at assembly, each week and we also post children's achievements on X, if we have the parental consent to do so.

Class teachers will ensure that they give House Points regularly and that all children are achieving, at their own level. In addition, we will also be introducing a Rainbow Certificate, for children who have achieved 15 points. Hopefully, this improvement will mean that all children receive recognition for the House Points that they earn, within a session.

Class Structure for Session 2025-2026/Pupil Progress Reports: In coming weeks, we will begin to formulate our class structure for next session. We are given this information from the Authority and it is likely that our current structure of 13 classes, will remain in place for next session. We will bring more news of this, as and when we have the information to share. On **Monday 16th June**, we will share Pupil Progress Reports for the session with you, alongside information on the class that your child will go into, next session, as well as details of their teacher(s). As per the norm, this information will be sent home, in a sealed envelope, in children's bags. Please make a note to check bags carefully that evening so that you have all of the information that you need.



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Learning, Teaching and Assessment: Health and Wellbeing: After the May holiday, all classes will begin a block of learning in Health and Wellbeing, on Relationships and Parenthood. This work is age-appropriate and is taught, using a national resource, which is used by all schools, across Scotland to ensure that all children and young people benefit from the same information. We will send an email to all families, in due course, providing access to the resource, which may be helpful in supporting any conversations at home. Thank you for your support with this.

Linlithgow Twinning Association: Guyancourt News: French Student in School: You may remember that we have been re-establishing our links, in France, with the local schools and community in Guyancourt. We are delighted that a French student has joined us this week, in P4A, to work with Ms Daniels and her class. The student will learn English for the week, alongside the children in P4, as well as joining in with all activities in school. She will also benefit from going on a local walk with the class to learn about the town of Linlithgow. Thank you to Ms Daniels for all of her hard work to make this project possible.

Reading Schools Silver Award: Novel Navigators: We are so grateful to Mrs Bryce and the Novel Navigators, Pupil Leadership Group, who enabled us to receive the fantastic, Reading Schools Silver Award, at the end of March. This award shows the significant work that our school community has undertaken to promote a love of books, and of reading across all stages. Pupils in each class, are given time to read for pleasure each day, as part of the timetable, as well as to visit the school library with their class and enjoy the wide variety of texts on offer. We also support children to access texts in different forms, including graphic novels and audio books, to meet their individual needs and preferences.

Pupil Equity Group: Dragon's Den Initiative: Livingston Stadium: Representatives from our Pupil Equity group, supported by Mrs Menmuir, presented their work on Social Enterprise in front of an audience at Livingston Stadium, in early March. This was part of the Dragon's Den opportunity, run by the Social Enterprise Academy. The children who took part, 'pitched' their work around our Blether Café to the audience and were highly commended for doing so. Our Blether Café, continues to be a very popular and inspiring social enterprise activity which benefits both our school and the wider community. Well done to all pupils who took part. We are so proud of you. ⁽³⁾

Pupil Equity Group: Cost of the School Day: Recognition: Another success for our Pupil Equity Group, saw children attending a special event at Boghall Primary School, with Mrs Matos. The event was to celebrate the work of identified West Lothian Schools in reducing the cost of the school day for families and enabling equity for all. The Cabinet Secretary for Education, attended the event and spoke with staff and children there. It was an honour for our school to be invited to this and we are very proud of our achievements in this area. During

Pupil Leadership Groups: Wellbeing Wanderers: The Wellness Wanderers have been working hard to promote health and wellbeing throughout our school community. They started by designing a mascot to represent the Wellness Wanderers and spark interest in their mission. They also reflected on past Health Week activities and came up with some fresh ideas of their own. In addition, they've been actively encouraging participation in Junior Parkrun by handing out QR codes to make registration easier. Most recently, they've been preparing a school-wide assembly on diversity, which they're excited to present on May 2nd.

Date for your diary: Reminder: P6/7 School Show: As you may be aware, some children in Primary 6 and 7 have been busy rehearsing for their production of Oliver. The performances will take place on **Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd of May**.

For main cast, their performance night with be confirmed prior to tickets going on sale. Please remember these cast members are still part of the production on the alternative evening.

Doors will open at 6pm on both evenings, with the performances starting at 6.30pm. Cast will be asked to come to the school slightly earlier, time will be confirmed closer to the production. There will be an interval during the show, where refreshments will be on sale.

Tickets will be on sale on the iPay shop, available to cast members and their families first, then offered out to the rest of the school. Tickets will cost $\pounds 5$ for adults and $\pounds 3$ for children.

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REMINDERS:
