Pupil Equity Funding (PEF) Summary

Linlithgow Primary School is continuously committed to developing our approach to ensure equity for all and tackle the poverty related attainment gap. Pupil Equity Fund (PEF) is additional funding from the Scottish Government which is allocated directly to schools and is targeted at closing the poverty-related attainment gap. Our PEF summary provides an overview of our approach and a brief summary on how PEF is distributed to provide a variety of universal and targeted interventions.

In 2024/25 Linlithgow Primary Schools allocation was approximately £31 000

The allocated money was used to provide resources and staffing to deliver a variety of interventions and to further enhance children's learning.

Pupil Equity Funding was allocated as follows:

- ⇒ Listening to the voice of pupils, staff and parents/carers and using part of our PEF to subsidise school trips and excursions
- ⇒ Providing free afterschool clubs to promote participation and wellbeing
- ⇒ Reducing the cost of the school day by promoting our uniform swap shop and sharing shelf
- ⇒ Pupils receiving nurture to support wellbeing and further develop social skills
- ⇒ Identified pupils supported with reading and writing through targeted interventions
- ⇒ Investing in staffing to support identified pupils and deliver interventions across Literacy, Numeracy and Maths.

Plans for session 2025/26:

- ⇒ Work with families with a focused approach in improving attendance for targeted pupils
- ⇒ Targeted afterschool clubs to promote participation
- ⇒ Building on the foundations of reading and writing with targeted interventions with a focus on phonics and common words
- ⇒ Targeted reading and writing interventions with a focus on WL core targets
- ⇒ Targeted Numeracy support for identified pupils

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
