Extra- Curricular Club Programme: October 2025 onwards: Our Extra-Curricular programme, is due to start after the October break and we couldn't be more excited with this year's programme. Thank you to all staff, wider-partners and parent volunteers, who have agreed to run clubs for us. We are going to be running a host of clubs, including; dance, book club, chess and arts and crafts as well as sports clubs.

Pupil Leadership/Voice Opportunity: Biscuit and Blether: A Learning Walk and a Discussion about Reading in School: This session, our fantastic Heads of Year, Alexis and Zac, are responsible for running our "Biscuit and Blether" sessions. 'Biscuit and Blether' is an opportunity for different pupils from across school, to come together to talk about things that happen in school and to make suggestions for things that could be improved.

In their first session, Alexis and Zac, supported by Mrs Gordon, met with representatives from each class, to discuss reading. As a school, we are re-examining our approaches to teaching reading as part of our improvement priorities. Part of the discussions at Biscuit and Blether, involved a' learning walk.' During the 'learning walk', the children visited the infant area to have a peek in the P1 and P2 classrooms and to look for evidence of reading.

On the learning walk, pupils discovered that the infant classrooms have lots of excellent reading resources. They have wonderful libraries and many of the classrooms have little interactive reading displays, with books and props, linking reading to current topics and to Health and Wellbeing.

Pupils who attended Biscuit and Blether were also asked the following question: "What do you like about reading, in LPS?". Here are some of the children's answers:

- -Finlay in P5b said: "We have a good library"
- Evie in P7a and Jorgi in P5a said: "We enjoy reading in "Calm Me" time as it helps our minds to relax and to be calm.

In answer to the question; "What could we improve about the way in which we teach reading?"

- -Macaulay in P4 said "I would like to see more comic and action books."
- -Charlie in P7b said: "I would like more whole class reading time and more football books."
