In addition, Mrs McDonald will be joining us as a Pupil Support Worker in nursery, to help us on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday mornings.

**Learning, Teaching and Assessment/Curriculum News: Book Study:** This term, pupils in P1-P6, will be studying a fiction book of their choice, based on children's interests. **Pupil Equity Group: Inclusive Classrooms Audit:** Members of our Pupil Equity Group, will be working with Mrs Gordon to support our school, self-evaluation work, in coming weeks. Self-evaluation means that we look at *how* we do things and *how well* we do them, before planning what to do next. The group are going to undertake an audit of our approaches to inclusion, in all classrooms, across school, before the Christmas holidays. The children will be thinking about what inclusion 'looks like' and 'feels like', for all children, and so that we know if we are getting it right for everyone. The group will be looking to see if classrooms have 'calm areas' for children to rest and relax in, as well as visual timetables, so that all pupils know what is going to happen and when. They will also look at seating arrangements in classrooms and which resources are available, to ensure that everything is fair and equitable for all children. The results of the children's audit will be used to plan improvements for pupils.

**Health and Wellbeing Success: Junior Parkrun: Feedback:** It was wonderful to see so many of our children and families at the Junior Parkrun event which was held at Xcite, Linlithgow on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November. The theme for the run was 'fancy dress' and it was incredible to see so many little children, running on a Sunday morning in their different, costumes. Well done to the Junior Parkrun team and to everyone who took part. What a great (and healthy!) way to bring so many different members of our local community together!

Health and Wellbeing Updates: Trauma Skills 2 Training: Our teaching staff team, recently took part in a morning's training session to develop their understanding of trauma and the way that this can impact children and other members of our school community. The session was led by colleagues from Education and from NHS Lothian. Staff will use the knowledge gained from the session to continue to support children in school. We know that trauma can impact everyone so please, just reach out, via the school office, if we can ever offer your child, or your family, further support. We are always here to help.

Pupil Achievements: School Football Team: Cluster Schools League: Our School Football Team, recently played against cluster schools, in their first league game at Linlithgow Academy. The children who took part displayed excellent football skills as well as showing respect for others. Well done to all children who took part and thank you to Miss Hunter and Mrs Chisholm for supporting the team.

**UNCRC/Children's Right of the Month: Article 36 and Article 19:** This month, as we approach Bonfire Night, we will be focusing on Article 36 – protection from harm and Article 19 – the right to be safe.

At Linlithgow Primary School, we have been teaching children about how to enjoy Bonfire Night safely, by learning about the dangers of fireworks and how to make sensible choices during celebrations. Road safety continues to be taught throughout the school year, ensuring that children understand how to keep themselves safe in different situations. Later this month, we will also take part in Anti-Bullying Week, reinforcing our message that everyone has the right to feel safe, respected, and supported.

Every child in our school has at least one trusted adult whom they can talk to, whenever they need help or reassurance. We hope that this also helps our children to feel safe, supported and listened to.

We are also using 'Calm Me' time, in all classrooms, once each day, when children have a short, quiet period to reflect and relax, whilst feeling safe within their classroom. Since August, we have

#### **REMINDERS:**

**Parking and Stopping around School:** Please drive and park safely on Preston Road for the safety of all children. Please also, avoid using our school car park for parking or stopping at any time. The car park is for staff use only, unless you are a Blue Badge holder.

**Child Protection:** Please speak to Miss Baillie/Mrs Gordon if you have any concerns about the safety or welfare of any child in our school community. You can also phone Broxburn Social Work Department (Children and Families), to report a concern for any child on 01506 284440 at any time. It's the job of everyone to keep children safe.

**P.E Kit:** Please can we ask that children have a P.E kit available at all times in school? Sometimes, staff will take children for an extra P.E lesson and or activity that is better suited to sportswear. In younger years, a P.E kit is helpful if children have an accident and need to be changed in school. Thank you for your help with this.

**Drinks in school:** Please help us to help our children to learn best, by only providing water for them to drink in school. We don't allow energy drinks in school as many of these aren't recommended for children's consumption.

**Dogs in the playground:** Please remember that it is West Lothian Council policy that dogs are not allowed in our school playground or grounds at any time. Thank you for your help with this important matter.

**Labelling clothing:** We still have a large volume of lost property in school each day. Please help us to re-unite lost items with their owner by labelling all items that children wear and/or bring to school.

**Outdoor Clothing:** Please help us to allow children to play and learn outdoors, in all weathers, by ensuring that they come to school wearing waterproof jackets and have appropriate footwear. Many thanks for your help with this.
