Learning, Teaching and Assessment/School Curriculum: P1-7 Business Enterprise Activities: Our pupils, from P1-7, have been learning about the World of Work through their different, business enterprise experiences, this term.

Primary 1 and Primary 2, have been investigating how to put on an event/performance for others, as part of their work around the Nativity.

Children in Primaries 3 to 6, have created Christmas crafts, to sell to families and friends, as part of our P3-7 Christmas Marketplace, on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> December, from 2-3pm.

Primary 7 have gone one step further, and as well as creating goods and services to sell at the Marketplace, they have also been learning how to set up and run a successful business including; finding out about different ways to advertise as well as simple financial concepts, such as profit and loss.

**Pupil Equity Group: Christmas Blether Café Success:** Our Pupil Equity Group along with Mrs Ferguson, Mrs Gordon and an amazing band of volunteers, did an outstanding job of running, the most successful Blether Café, that we've ever had, on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> of November! The teas and coffees, never stopped pouring and the hall was a buzz of activity and chatter. Well done to our school choir and to Ms Quigley and Mrs Cameron for leading them, in fine form. We are very proud of you!

**P7: Bike Buddies Project:** Our Primary 7 pupils have recently had a marvellous opportunity to engage with a new, Bike Buddies project in conjunction with FEL Scotland and Linlithgow Community Development Trust. Bike Buddies connects directly, with the new, Active School Travel Hub at Linlithgow Academy, with the idea being, that encouraging children to cycle to school, is helping them to make healthy and sustainable choices, in the longer term.

As part of the project, families can take part in Linlithgow Bike Library, which provides pupils with access to a quality bike, which is serviced regularly and can be used for cycling to school as well as for using out with school.

The team from Bike Buddies, also offered a 'Doctor Bike' session in school to enable pupils to bring in bikes from home, to be serviced for the winter. What a great project and we are so grateful to the team, behind Bike Buddies, for providing this opportunity for our children!

**STEM Room/Maker Spacers Plea: One Person's Trash is Another Person's Treasure!** This month, we are looking for any donations of stamps, stencils and ink pads that you may have at home and may be looking to pass on. West Lothian Schools Creativity in Literacy Competition 2025-2026: This session, we are hoping to take part in the West Lothian Schools, Creativity in Literacy Competition, to highlight the innovative work, that we've doing in Literacy, across school, of late.
